# RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS OF THE GOVERNING BODY CITY OF BUCKLIN, KANSAS August 23, 2021

The City Council of the City of Bucklin, Kansas, met in regular session on August 23, 2021, at 7:00 p.m., in the Council Chambers at Bucklin City Hall, 117 West Oak Street, Bucklin, Kansas, with Mayor Sellard presiding-via Zoom. Present were Councilmembers Cody Warden, Kirk Esplund, Brian Bostelmann, Kraig Lindsay, and Toni Dome. City staff present were City Clerk Rikki Hager, City Superintendent Jason Goracke. ### **CALL TO ORDER**

There being a quorum of Councilmembers present, the meeting was called to order by Mayor Sellard, at 7:00 pm.

### **PUBLIC HEARING**

Council President Warden called the advertised Revenue Neutral Rate public hearing for the 2022 City of Bucklin Budget to order at 6:30 pm. Receiving no comments, Council President Warden closed the public hearing at 6:45pm.

Councilmember Esplund motioned to approve Resolution No, 2021-003, for the Revenue Neutral Rate for the 2022 City of Bucklin Budget.

With all of the Councilmembers voting in favor of the motion, the motion carried 4/0.
